

We reject the new invasion of Haiti with alarm and indignation.

We, the undersigned Haiti Solidarity Committees and other popular organizations from all of Latin America and the Caribbean, reject with indignation, the decision of the UN Security Council to authorize the deployment of an armed Multinational invasion force to Haiti, supposedly to support the dictatorial government of that country in combating paramilitary gangs and organizing elections. It will not be an official UN mission but a mission organized directly by the US, which, together with Ecuador, presented the resolution that was approved today on the first day of Brazil's presidency of the Council, with 13 votes in favor and Russia and China abstaining.

Alarmed, we ask: what has the UN become? We denounce the imperialist, racist and genocidal character of this illegal "authorization" to invade a sovereign country to control its people and we repudiate the rhetoric of "solidarity" and "support for the people of Haiti" with which it seeks to camouflage its macabre intentions.

It is not "solidarity" with the people of Haiti to respond to the unconstitutional request formulated by a dictatorial government, put in place and maintained by the same "international community" that now redoubles its support contrary to the legitimate demands of a huge range of Haitian social, political and humanitarian organizations, ignoring once again the sovereignty and self-determination of the Haitian people with their demands and proposals to resolve this crisis generated by the same long-standing foreign intervention.

It is not "support" to continue ignoring the people of Haiti, ignoring their denunciations that link Ariel Henry, the current de facto government and its "international protectors", headed by the U.S., with the proliferation of the armed gangs that these same actors are now trying to control through this new invasion. The paramilitary bands were created by the governments of Michel Martelli, Jovenel Moïse and Ariel Henry, the Haitian oligarchy and the US from where the arms and ammunition come from. They are politically instrumentalized to control the great popular movement that has developed in recent years in Haiti; a nationalist, anti-oligarchic, anti-imperialist, anti-occupation movement, struggling to live in freedom, for the recovery of its sovereignty and the respect of all its rights.

We denounce the US and the UN, which has become a direct instrument of aggression and domination of the US and the European Union. Through the UN, the US imposes its agenda. Haiti has been under UN occupation since 2004, occupied militarily by MINUSTAH for 13 years, then by police forces - MINUJUSTH -, today by a political mission called BINUH, which together with the so-called "Core Group" gives the political and economic directives in Haiti. This group is made up of the U.S., France, Spain, Brazil, Germany, Canada, the European Union, as well as representatives of the UN and the OAS.

In addition to the invasion itself, MINUSTAH has been responsible for massacres, electoral fraud, looting of resources, sexual abuse and abandoned children, introduction of the cholera epidemic, and other similarly serious acts. Neither the UN

nor any of the participating countries have assumed any reparations for the more than 30,000 dead and other damages and victims.

We repudiate these crimes and the fact that instead of sanctioning those responsible and ensuring reparations for the crimes committed under its command, the UN directly hands over the organization and control of this new invasion to the US, which seeks to impose, after controlled elections, a new government of its henchmen. The agenda then foresees the reform of the Constitution and the consolidation of an autocratic power to continue the plundering of Haiti and the subjugation of its people.

The Haitian people through their social, political and humanitarian organizations have expressed themselves clearly against any occupation and against any controlled election under occupation. We reiterate our solidarity with them, and call for broad support for their demands for the formation of an independent international commission to evaluate the impact of previous interventions as well as respect for the Montana agreements and other demands of the Haitian people.
